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Itinerary

This itinerary reflects the June 4–14, 2023 trip dates. For June 14–24, 2023, this itinerary will be reversed, from Glasgow Scotland, to Aberdeen, Scotland.

Day 1: Aberdeen, Scotland **Begin Your Adventure**

Board the *Ocean Endeavour* for an evening departure after enjoying some self-guided exploration in Aberdeen.

Many of the historic stone buildings here are made of locally quarried granite; high in mica, they can sparkle like silver. The city is also famed for its forty-five parks, gardens, and floral displays.

Day 2: Fair Isle **Enjoy Birdwatching & Quaint Island Culture**

Journey to charming Fair Isle, once a Viking hub and now an idyllic island colony of artists and shepherds. Keep your binoculars handy to spot some of the 350 bird species that the island boasts, including puffins and great skuas in great numbers. Take a tour of the local museum, dedicated to preserving island heritage.

Day 3: Papa Stour and Foula **Take a Zodiac Cruise**

Explore the rugged coastline and spot flourishing marine and bird life among Papa Stour's cliffs, caves, sea stacks, and blowholes on a morning Zodiac cruise.

Call in at sweet and petite Foula, twenty-three kilometres west of the Shetland Islands, home to just a few dozen folks. Keep an eye out for the Arctic terns, red-throated divers, and great skuas that may be found here.

Day 4: Kirkwall, Orkney **Visit the Heart of Neolithic Orkney UNESCO World Heritage Site**

Wander through the stone walls of the Heart of Neolithic Orkney, where you'll find the 4,000-year-old Ring of Brodgar.

Tour the Hall of Clestrain, childhood home of Arctic explorer John Rae and take in the sights of the city of Kirkwall, dominated by the massive St. Magnus Cathedral, dating from 1137.

Day 5: Stornoway, Lewis **Witness Modern & Ancient Scottish Culture**

Visit Stornoway on the isle of Lewis, a Gaelic stronghold and the capital of the largest of the Hebrides. Browse charming shops to purchase the island's famous tweed.

Stroll through one of Britain's best preserved Stone Age sites, Callanish's standing stones.

Day 6: St. Kilda

Journey to St. Kilda UNESCO World Heritage Site

Venture to the tiny, far-flung archipelago of St. Kilda, which has been uninhabited since 1930.

Wander amongst this fascinating UNESCO World Heritage site that protects the former community as well as natural heritage features. Hike to enormous cliffs offering dramatic ocean views, home to millions of seabirds.

Day 7: Outer Hebrides

Explore Uninhabited Isles

Reach islands that are only accessible by Zodiac during an expedition landing to the Outer Hebrides—a fantastic collection of over 100 islands seventy kilometres off Scotland’s west coast.

Take note of archaeological remains that reveal the oldest evidence of human habitation in Scotland, with influence from Pictish, Norse, and Scottish cultures.

Day 8: Skye

Enjoy Photography, Birdwatching, and Hiking

Cruise the southwestern shore of this large island to visit Loch Coruisk, a freshwater lake accessed through Loch Scavaig. Choose the level of activity that suits you best for a walk, hike, or trek among one of the finest mountainscapes in Britain, the Cuillin hills.

Day 9: Iona and Staffa

Make a Pilgrimage to Iona Abbey & Fingal's Cave

Visit Iona, the burial place of kings. Admire the beautifully restored Iona Abbey complex, which preserves two outstanding crosses dating as far back as the eighth century.

Take a Zodiac cruise at the Isle of Staffa, famed for basaltic formations and Fingal’s Cave. See for yourself why it provided the inspiration for Mendelssohn’s overture, *The Hebrides*.



Day 10: Islay

Tour the Gruinart Nature Reserve & Sample Whisky

Wet your whistle on Islay, known for its fine whisky. If you’re a Scotch lover, you can select an optional enhancement to tour the world-famous distilleries. Stop in at the Loch Finlaggan historic site, home of the Lords of the Isles and Clan Donald, and visit the Gruinart Nature Reserve, a habitat for barnacle goose, hen harriers, and corncrakes.

Day 11: Glasgow, Scotland

Wave a Fond Farewell

Complete your journey by disembarking the *Ocean Endeavour* from Greenock in the morning and taking a coach transfer to Glasgow. Say your farewells in this city of rich maritime history that was a major shipbuilding and import centre.





Day 3: Fair Isle

Enjoy Birdwatching at a Quaint Island Community

Journey to charming Fair Isle, once a Viking hub and now an idyllic island colony of artists and shepherds. Keep your binoculars handy to spot some of the 350 bird species that the island boasts, including puffins and great skuas in great numbers. Take a tour of the local museum, dedicated to preserving island heritage.

Day 4: Sumba, Suðuroy Island, Faroe Islands

Immerse Yourself in Faroese Culture & Spectacular Hiking

Visit the village of Sumba on Suðuroy Island, occupied since the seventh century and a stronghold of Faroese chain dancing.

Hike the foothills of nearby Beinisvørð Mountain, affording spectacular, panoramic views of the region. See for yourself why the island is famed for its dramatic cliffs and enjoy this paradise for birds, including European storm petrels and Atlantic puffins.

Day 5: Tórshavn

Visit Galleries, Shops, and Restaurants

Explore the splendid little city of Tórshavn ("Thor's harbour"), the Faroe Islands' capital and a former Viking trading centre.

Be sure to stop in at the treasured national art gallery at Nordic House, surrounded by gor-

geous grounds with walking trails. Experience excellent shopping, restaurants, and pubs.

Day 6–7: Western Faroe Islands

Soak in Dramatic Mountains & Waterfalls

Travel to the northwestern shores of Eysturoy and Streymoy islands, perfect for hiking, birding, and photography. You'll love these charming villages connected by high-tech tunnels through mountains and beneath the ocean floor, a unique and startling infrastructure feature.

Take the perfect photo at the Múlafossur waterfall in Gásadalur, a small village home to about twenty people reached via one such tunnel—but look for the old switchback trail over the mountain, once used by the local postman when this village was only accessible by foot!



Day 8: Mykines Island

Delight in Excellent Birdwatching

Make a stop at Mykines, the westernmost of the Faroe Islands and a geological marvel, where great columns of basalt tower thirty metres above the ocean.

Enjoy excellent birdwatching on the islet of Mykineshólmur, connected by a forty-metre footbridge to the western end of Mykines, famed for its sea stacks and a lighthouse dating to 1909.

Day 9: At Sea

Learn Onboard

Deepen your understanding of the environment, cultures, and history of the region as we steam across the North Atlantic towards Iceland. Enjoy workshops and presentations, watch a documentary, and get out on deck!

Day 10: Heimaey, Vestmannaeyjar (Westman Islands), Iceland

Marvel at Volcanic Landscapes

Witness geology in action at Vestmannaeyjar, lying off the south coast of Iceland and comprised of fourteen islands, numerous rocks, and skerries. Learn about the compelling history of this volcanically active area that has experienced two major eruptions in recent times.

1963 saw the formation of the island of Surtsey and the Eldfell eruption ten years later destroyed much of Heimaey, the largest of the Vestmannaeyjars. Enjoy a beautiful Zodiac cruise searching for the numerous species of seabirds that nest in the steep rock faces.

Day 11: Reykjavík, Iceland

Day 1: Reykjavík, Iceland

Begin Your Adventure

Board the *Ocean Endeavour* for an evening departure after enjoying a day of self-guided exploration in Reykjavík. Iceland's cosmopolitan capital, Reykjavík was established in the year 874 CE. Powered by geothermal energy, Reykjavík is widely considered one of the cleanest, greenest cities on Earth.

Day 2: Snæfellsnes Peninsula

Meander Dramatic Landscapes

Explore one of Iceland's most amazing coastlines, the Snæfellsnes Peninsula, a region known for its dramatic beauty and fascinating geological history. Delight in the many opportunities to observe seabirds and marine life as you stroll, hike, or take a Zodiac cruise.

Day 3: The Westfjords

Explore Remote Coastlines

Be among the lucky few to explore the Westfjords, a region known for its jagged bird cliffs and multihued beaches—only about ten percent of the rest of Iceland's visitors ever make it here! Soak up the coastal fjords, immense mountains, and tiny villages that embrace a traditional Icelandic lifestyle.

Day 4: Siglufjörður and Grímsey

Cross the Arctic Circle & Learn about Icelandic History

Travel to far-flung Grímsey, which lies upon the Arctic Circle (66° 33' North) and earns Iceland its title as one of the world's eight Arctic nations—just barely! Take a Zodiac cruise around the island, brimming with a million seabirds, including puffins, guillemots, and gulls.

Visit resurgent Siglufjörður that, in its heyday, bustled with activity as the centre of the herring fishing industry. Enjoy a wonderful re-enactment at the Herring Era Museum and make some time to pop into the bakery, chocolate factory, brewery, and Icelandic folk music centre, too.

Day 5: Akureyri

Visit Museums & Botanical Gardens

Walk up to the steps of Akureyri's monumental Lutheran church to catch the full view of Iceland's second-largest urban area. Poke around and explore the city's shops, cafés, and restaurants and take your pick from a selection of ten museums to discover. Stroll through Akureyri's botanical gardens that are among the northernmost in the world and miraculously grow several thousand plant species.

Day 6: Húsavík

Go Whale Watching

Tour Húsavík's Skjálfandi Bay, known as the whale capital of Iceland. Be sure to bring your binoculars to spot the fifteen different whale

species frequent the area, as well as dolphins and dozens of varieties of birds.

Take advantage of Húsavík's diverse museum offerings, including the Whale Museum and the Exploration Museum, which houses artefacts from Apollo astronaut training in the area.

Day 7: Seyðisfjörður

Wander a Picturesque Community & Visit the Skálanes Nature Reserve

Enjoy the chance to explore Seyðisfjörður, nestled at the tip of its namesake fjord. Stroll the picturesque town of 700, known for its art scene, cobbled rainbow road, and excellent handicrafts, or take one of the numerous opportunities for hiking, including a walk up to Tvisöngur sound sculpture on a nearby hill.

Visit nearby Skálanes Nature Reserve, which is family-owned and operated. Learn about the centre's research and interpretation of Iceland's environment and cultural history that's a model for sustainable tourism.



Day 8: Southeast Iceland

Witness Beautiful Glaciers & Lagoons

Soak in the sights of south Iceland, home to some of the country's most beautiful natural attractions. Explore a unique mix of volcanoes, lagoons, and glaciers—as well as hot springs,



geysers, and spectacular waterfalls—either ashore on foot or by Zodiac cruise.

Day 9: Heimaey, Vestmannaeyjar (Westman Islands)

Marvel at Volcanic Landscapes

Learn about the compelling history of this volcanically active area that has experienced two major eruptions in recent times. 1963 saw the formation of the island of Surtsey and the Eldfell eruption ten years later destroyed much of Heimaey, the largest of the Vestmannaeyjars and the only island here that is inhabited.

Enjoy a beautiful Zodiac cruise searching for the numerous species of seabirds, including the famous puffin, that nest in the steep rock faces along the ocean cliffs here.

Day 10: Reykjavík, Iceland

Wave a Fond Farewell

Complete your journey back in Reykjavík and disembark the *Ocean Endeavour* in the morning. Take one last chance to explore this special city where food, culture, and nightlife abound.

Day 1: Reykjavík, Iceland

Begin Your Adventure

Board the *Ocean Endeavour* for an evening departure after enjoying a day of self-guided exploration in Reykjavík. Iceland's cosmopolitan capital, Reykjavík was established in the year 874 CE. Powered by geothermal energy, this is widely considered one of the cleanest, greenest cities on Earth.

Day 2: At Sea

Set Sail like the Vikings

Watch for whales and seabirds as we sail the Denmark Strait. You'll be truly in the wake of the Vikings as we journey westward from Iceland. The onboard learning program will prepare you for the archaeology, history, culture, and wildlife that await you in Greenland!

Day 3-5: East Greenland

Witness Fjords, Icebergs, & Whales

Explore the remote reaches of east Greenland by ship, in Zodiacs, and on land. Your first views of this seldom-visited region will reveal a stunning coastline traced with innumerable fjords and potentially dotted with pack ice. Join our expedition team out on deck to watch for iconic Arctic wildlife, such as muskox, seals, and humpback whales.

Day 6: Ikerasassuaq (Prince Christian Sound)

Marvel at Mountains & Glaciers

Make the most of your time out on deck, as our experts scout for opportunities to go ashore along this breathtaking landscape. Soak in the breathtaking beauty of one of the world's most majestic waterways, Ikerasassuaq (Prince Christian Sound). Here, craggy mountain peaks tower over still waters fed by calving glaciers.

Day 7: South Greenland

Visit Kujataa UNESCO World Heritage Site

Pay a visit to Kujataa, where Norse settlement history intersects with contemporary Greenlandic life. Admire the jagged mountains that rise from beyond green pastures, with sheep farms directly bordering ice fjords. Along the southern coast of Greenland, the land is fertile, agriculture thrives, and farms and vegetable husbandry contrast with the ice that covers so much of the rest of the country.

Day 8: Hvalsey

Immerse Yourself in Viking Archaeology

Walk amongst the ruins of captivating history! Learn more about the settlement at Hvalsey, a major Norse centre in the early centuries of the last millennium. Hvalsey Church is the best-preserved Norse ruin in Greenland—the last

known record from the original Norse colony is of a wedding held here in September 1408!

Day 9: Brattahlíð

Tour a Reconstructed Norse Settlement

Visit fascinating Brattahlíð, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Walk amongst a reconstructed Norse church and Viking longhouse to fully immerse yourself in the experience. It was once the home of Viking explorer Erik the Red and his descendants until the 1400s. Today, Greenlandic Inuit run the sheep farms originally worked by Norse settlers.

Day 10: Sermersooq

Enjoy Birdwatching & Zodiac Cruising

Explore the Sermersooq region of Greenland by Zodiac or by foot. Here you'll find a stunning myriad of mountain peaks, glaciers, and deep fjords, with records of human habitation that stretch back over 1,500 years. Keep a look out for *nattoralik* (white-tailed eagles), seabirds, and marine mammals while you enjoy the lush vegetation of southwest Greenland.

Day 11: Nuuk

Visit Museums, Shops, and Cafés

Stop in at vibrant Nuuk, the capital of Greenland. Visit the Greenland National Museum, where the world-famous Qilakitsoq mummies rest. The old harbour includes many buildings dating from Danish colonial days, while con-

temporary Nuuk is known for art, shopping, pubs, and cafés.

Day 12: Kangerlussuatsiaq Fjord (Evighedsfjorden)
Take a Zodiac Cruise at the Foot of a Glacier

See why Kangerlussuatsiaq lives up to its Danish name, Evighedsfjorden, which means “the fjord of eternity.” Marvel at this complex coastal waterway that includes calving glaciers, sheer bird cliffs, and streams cascading against a towering mountain backdrop. Explore this sublime glacial landscape by ship and by Zodiac.

Day 13: Kangerlussuaq, Greenland

Cross the Arctic Circle

Complete your journey up Kangerlussuaq Fjord (Søndre Strømfjord), a 190-kilometre-long fjord surrounded by mountains and glaciers, and cross the Arctic Circle on your way.

Transfer by Zodiac to shore, then ride to the airport by bus for your charter flight to Toronto, ON.





Stretch your legs with a walk or hike at Gros Morne National Park. Soak in the extraordinary views of beautiful Bonne Bay and be sure to take time to explore the park's excellent interpretation centre and the town of Woody Point.

Witness for yourself the spectacular Tablelands, a six-hundred-metre plateau that forms one of the world's best examples of exposed mantle. Normally found below the Earth's crust, the mineral-rich rocks support very little life, making the Tablelands an eerie landscape.

Explore Scenic Coastlines & Remote Outports

Journey through the beautiful and windswept coast of southern Newfoundland, dotted with bays, coves, and a few remaining remote outport communities. Admire outstanding geology and gorgeous botanical life. Spot plentiful birds, whales, and other wildlife as we make the most of every opportunity for Zodiac and land excursions. Experience Mi'kmaw Culture
