In Canada, we travel through Inuit Nunangat, including Nunavut, Nunavik, and Nunatsiavut. We also journey often within Mi'kmaq, Innu, and Haida territories. Internationally, we travel in Kalaallit Nunaat (Greenland) and elsewhere, where Indigenous rights, protocols, and colonial histories are place-specific and must be learned locally, with humility and care.

Wildlife spotting is often a highlight of our expeditions, but the untamed places we explore mean



animals can be elusive and unpredictable. Our expert guides take you where sightings are most likely, but luck is always a factor. Colonial seabirds may be reliable, but polar bears, muskoxen, walrus, and beluga require some good fortune and patience.

When wildlife appears, we'll get you as close as possible. We'll even alter the ship's course if necessary.

But we always keep a safe and respectful distance. After all, it's their home and we are the visitors.

A single moment shared with a wild animal can leave a lasting imprint, like a tattoo on the soul. It's these fleeting, extraordinary experiences that remind us we're part of something much bigger and we share some responsibility.

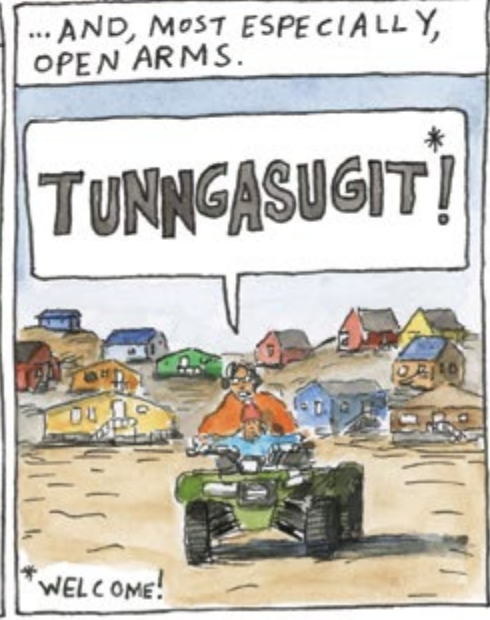
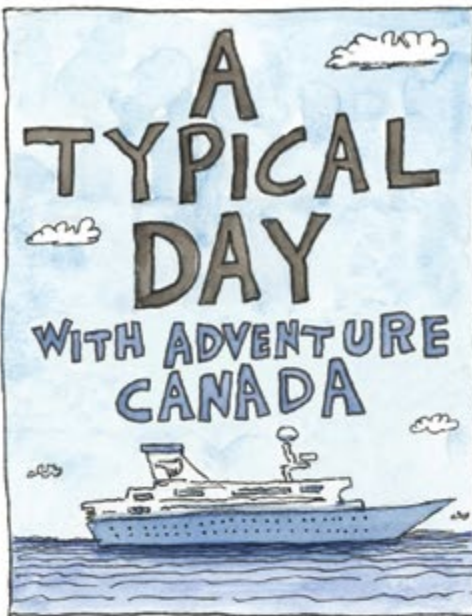

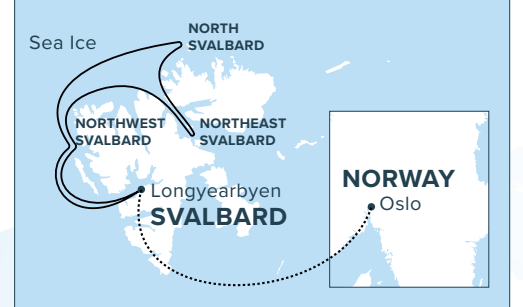

A Living Arctic Homeland

A living, storied seascape connects past and present. It holds together sovereignty and stewardship, people and place, and the long arc of exploration. This expedition invites you to experience the Arctic not as a frontier, but as a homeland: vibrant, enduring, and deeply alive, anchored by Inuit skill, wisdom, and resilience. Out here, each day holds that quiet, heart-lifting possibility of encountering iconic wildlife where it belongs, moving freely through a vast northern world.

HIGHLIGHTS

- › Journey through Inuit Nunangat in partnership with Inuit guides and cultural educators
- › Cross the Arctic Circle, seeking polar bears, seabirds, and other Arctic wildlife in their natural environments
- › Cruise among icebergs at Ilulissat Icefjord, a UNESCO World Heritage Site
- › Spend time in one of Canada's largest National Marine Conservation Areas, Tallurutiup Imanga, where marine life gathers in the cold, clear waters
- › Retrace the historic route of European explorers, who for centuries picked their way through ice in hopes of finding a sailing route through the passage
- › Transit Ikirahaq (Bellot Strait), the narrow and dramatic waterway at the very northern tip of continental North America

Where Ice Gives Way

As summer's endless daylight loosens its grip, the Northwest Passage changes character. Out of the Northwest Passage pairs historic waters with living Inuit culture, guided by Inuit educators and community hosts who share language, humour, and contemporary northern life. The sea still offers whales and ice, but the nights are often their own kind of wonder. With luck, the aurora borealis unfurls above the deck, green-and-violet ribbons that make even quiet moments feel ceremonial.

- › Watch for polar bears, walrus, seabirds, and other wildlife along the ice-scoured Arctic coast
- › Hope for the dazzling dance of the Northern Lights
- › Explore Tallurutiup Imanga (Lancaster Sound), a vital marine ecosystem and travel corridor
- › Seek your 'furthest north' in Smith Sound
- › Visit Ausuittuq (Grise Fiord), Canada's northernmost community
- › Cruise among icebergs at Ilulissat Icefjord, a UNESCO World Heritage Site

This voyage is knit together by welcome, wit, and the island's gift for turning history into living story, from a French-accented pause in Saint-Pierre to a Mi'kmaw welcome in Miawpukek and a kitchen party in François. Walk the otherworldly Tablelands in Gros Morne, trace UNESCO threads from Red Bay to L'Anse aux Meadows, and enjoy our Taste of Place culinary program.

- › Explore Red Bay, Labrador, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and the Basques' sixteenth century whaling hub

A Torngat Mountains Adventure

On the Canadian mainland, the Torngats rise as the highest peaks east of the Rockies, steep slopes surging from deep blue fjords where whales cruise and polar bears patrol. Ancient rock and open silence invite stillness and sharper attention. At the heart of the journey is Torngat Mountains National Park, shaped by Inuit leadership and knowledge, explored by foot and Zodiac at the land's pace. Newfoundland's music and sense of belonging, Inuit welcome in Nunatsiavut communities, and Nuuk's Kalaallit culture and contemporary life add vivid counterpoints.

HIGHLIGHTS

- › Travel through Inuit Nunangat with Inuit hosts who share their stories, art, and traditions
- › Hike and Zodiac amid soaring peaks and deep fjords in Inuit-managed Torngat Mountains National Park
- › Step ashore at L'Anse aux Meadows, where Indigenous and Norse histories meet at the edge of the Atlantic
- › Discover Nuuk, Greenland's vibrant capital, alive with Inuit culture, creativity, and colour
- › Travel alongside guides who call this route home, opening doors and sharing connections few travellers experience

Where Life Moves Quietly

The Great Bear Rainforest is shaped by the pulse of life at every scale, from salmon-fed rivers and whale-rich channels to the quiet, dark haunts of the rare spirit bear. Travel through fjords and old-growth forests where bears, wolves, and eagles move through one of the world's most intact temperate rainforests. Guided by Indigenous knowledge and careful observation, the journey centres patience, respect, and attentiveness in a place where wildlife presence is felt as much as it is seen.

HIGHLIGHTS

- › Search for the rare spirit bear within Gitga'at territory of the Great Bear Rainforest
- › Cruise narrow fjords and coastal channels known as whale "superhighways" and a visit to a whale research station
- › Experience the world's largest intact coastal temperate rainforest, with old-growth trees, moss-covered valleys, and rich coastal ecosystems
- › Visit Gitga'at communities, observing daily life, village sites, and coastal infrastructure
- › Explore the region by kayak and on foot, scanning shorelines and forest edges for coastal wolves, bears, birds, and marine life

Wildlife Wonders

In the Galápagos, life unfolds in plain sight—unafraid, unconventional, and shaped by isolation, fire, and sea. The journey moves among volcanic islands and nutrient-rich waters where giant tortoises follow ancient paths, marine iguanas slip into the surf, and seabirds nest within arm's reach. Across land and sea, evolution feels immediate and ongoing, with close encounters that invite curiosity, humility, and a deeper awareness of how life adapts, endures, and belongs.

- › Kayak, snorkel, and swim among sea lions, sea turtles, penguins, and sharks in the Galápagos' thriving marine ecosystems
- › Witness unforgettable wildlife encounters, including the blue-footed booby's iconic courtship dance
- › Explore stark volcanic landscapes shaped by lava flows, craters, and deep geological time
- › Discover Quito's layered history and artistry in one of Latin America's best-preserved UNESCO World Heritage centres, from hilltop viewpoints and landmark churches to everyday neighbourhood life and Andean flavours at the Equatorial Line
- › Visit the Charles Darwin Research Station to learn about conservation efforts, giant tortoises, and the archipelago's remarkable biodiversity

A Living Cultural Landscape

Imagine standing at the edge of towering old-growth forests, where ancient cedar trees stand as witnesses to deep continuity. Or walking along pristine beaches where ocean and sky seem to breathe together. This journey through Haida Gwaii unfolds slowly and intentionally. Guided by Haida knowledge and story, we encounter monumental art, powerful village sites, and wildlife-rich waters. Shared moments of quiet, learning, and awe invite deeper reflection on place, culture, and our relationship to the natural world.

HIGHLIGHTS

- › Journey into Gwaii Haanas, where land and sea are protected as one by Haida stewardship
- › Travel through coastal waters—sometimes by sea kayak—sharing space with seabirds and marine mammals within one of the North Pacific’s richest ecosystems
- › Engage with living culture at the Haida Gwaii Museum and Kay Llnagaay Heritage Centre, guided by story, art, and community knowledge
- › Visit forested village sites and shores accessible only by water, including SGang Gwaay Llnagaay, a UNESCO World Heritage Site where ancient cedars and Haida carved poles bear witness

North Atlantic Saga

Where the North Atlantic gathers its strength, islands rise that have shaped human endeavour, imagination, and continuity for thousands of years. This voyage carries you through Scotland, the Faroe Islands, and Iceland, places where stone monuments outlast memory, seabirds fill the skies, and landscapes are shaped by fire, ice, and the sea. For the traveller drawn to stories held in rock and coastline, this journey offers a rare opportunity to explore how culture, nature, and geography meet, and to experience the North Atlantic not as a boundary, but as a corridor through which people, ideas, and stories have long travelled.

HIGHLIGHTS

- › Discover Barra, the ancestral home of Clan MacNeil, and its iconic Kisimul Castle, standing offshore near Castlebay
- › Wander through one of Britain's most important Stone Age sites, the Calanais Standing Stones

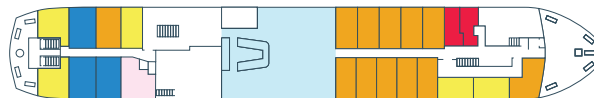

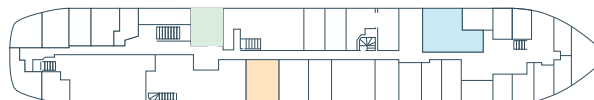
