Purpose-built for boutique expedition travel, *Cascadia* is a nimble, expedition-style catamaran designed to explore the wild and remote reaches of the British Columbia coast. With room for just 24 guests in 12 well-appointed cabins and a dedicated crew of 10, it offers a comfortable and intimate experience at sea.

Light-filled and thoughtfully designed, *Cascadia* balances elegance with functionality—perfectly suited for accessing secluded fjords, quiet anchorages, and culturally significant sites. Its small size ensures a human-scale voyage that honours the ecological and cultural integrity of the coastal communities and environments we visit.

Largest Cabins

Bridge Deck

- Outside-facing cabin with windows for natural light
- King-sized bed
- Wardrobes for storage
- Private three-piece en-suite bathroom
- Individually controlled climate systems
- Convenient access to both decks and ship interior
- Approximately 235 square feet

Cabin Category 2

Mid-sized Cabins

Main Deck

- Outside-facing cabin with windows for natural light
- Queen-sized bed or two twin beds
- Wardrobes for storage
- Private three-piece en-suite bathroom
- Individually controlled climate systems
- Convenient access to both decks and the corridor through separate doors
- Approximately 195 square feet

Cabin Category 1

Smallest Cabins

Main Deck

- Outside-facing cabin with two large porthole windows
- Queen-sized bed or two twin beds
- Wardrobes for storage
- Private three-piece en-suite bathroom
- Individually controlled climate systems
- Convenient door access to the inside of the ship corridor
- Approximately 160 square feet

Facilities

Bright and Spacious

Find comfort and solitude in your private cabin or enjoy time in any of the interior or outdoor lounges.

Salon

The perfect place to look for whales while staying protected, lounge on comfortable sofas, or enjoy a beverage from the nearby bar.

Dining Area

Sit and discuss your day's adventure with your expedition leader, naturalist, and travelling companions, afloat in a remote natural anchorage.

Terrace Lounge and Dining Area

Dine alfresco on temperate evenings, lounge with your morning coffee, or watch the world go by during the day.

Bridge

Cascadia's bridge is open to you. You'll have 180-degree views from here, along with being able to learn about navigation and the vessel systems.

Top Deck and Hot Tub

Lounge on a chaise, soak under the stars, or enjoy the bird's eye view of the ship and the world around her from *Cascadia's* new top deck.

Kayaks and Shore Boats

Cascadia has six double and two single kayaks for paddling in coves and bays, as well as two beautiful, custom-designed landing craft style tenders.

Other Equipment

Cascadia carries a suite of tools for exploring the natural world, including a hydrophone for listening to whales. The library contains books on coastal history.
